

If you are coming from the east, your first step is to make your way to Annapolis. From Annapolis there are 3 routes you can take to get to the Anne Arundel Radio Club.

If you are already on US Route 50, or are close to it, continue on US Route 50 headed west. Several miles west of Annapolis you will exit onto MD Route 424 as seen below.



This is a single exit with a traffic light at the end of the ramp. You will stay to the left, and at the light, make a left turn onto MD Route 424 south. Continue till you past the light at Governor's Bridge Road and at the next light turn right onto MD Route 214 as seen below. Yes, that is a deli, law office, pizza place, gas station straight ahead.

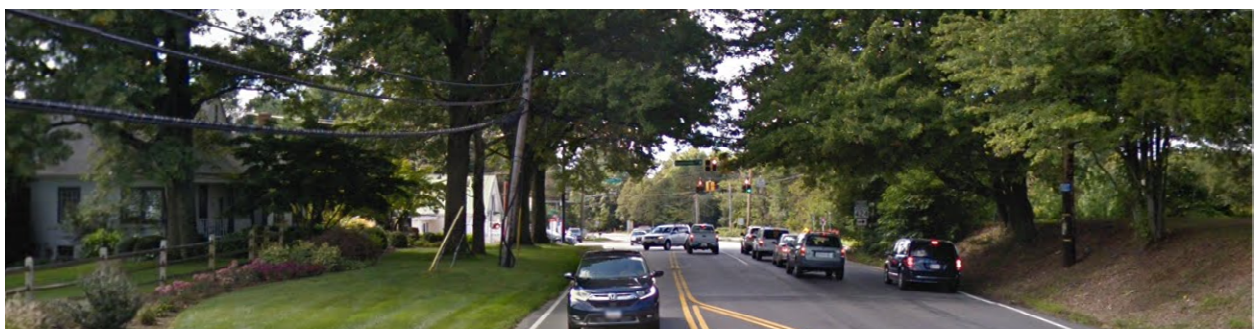


Your second route choice from Annapolis is to take Riva Road till it ends, shown below, and then turn right. You are now headed toward Washington DC on Central Avenue.

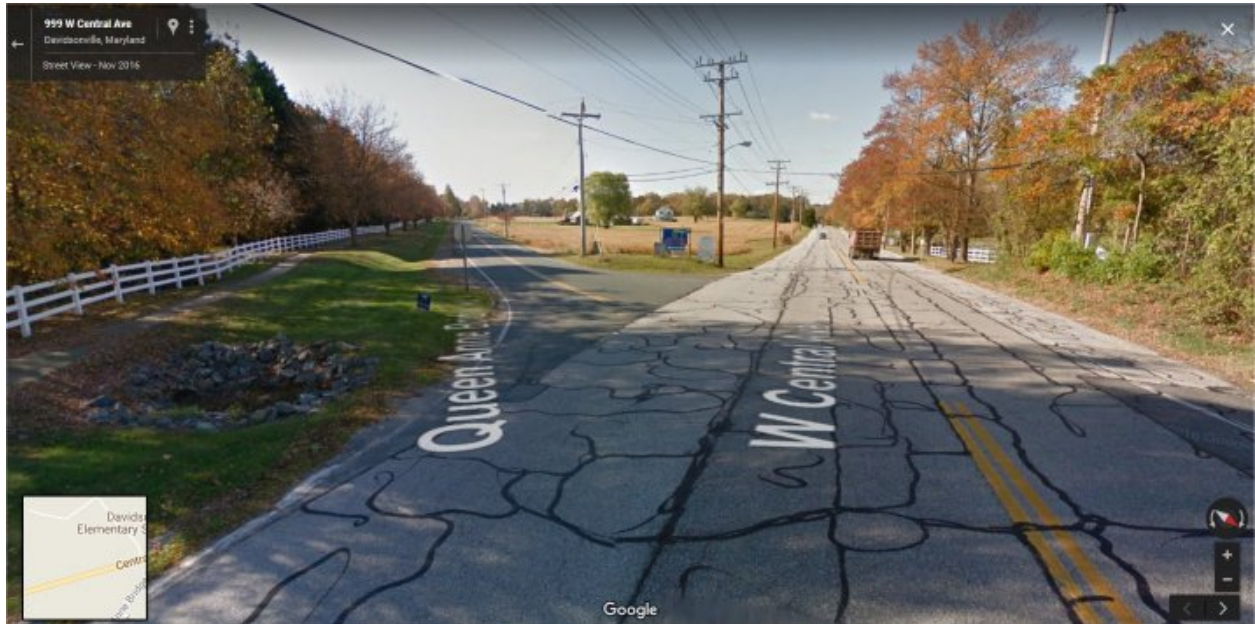


The third route from Annapolis is by taking MD Route 214, Central Avenue all the way from Edgewater, which will bring you traveling left to right through the intersection shown above.

At this point both the second and third routes are joined, and headed toward the intersection with the first route. When they meet, if you are already on MD Route 214, the intersection will look like the picture below. Homestead Gardens is on your left at this point. A combo gas station, pizza place, law office, deli is just through the trees on the left and you want to pass it and continue on MD Route 214, Central Avenue.



In less than a mile you will come upon the intersection shown below. When you reach it, take the soft left (45 degrees) onto Queen Anne Bridge Road. The blue sign about dead center in the picture directs people to turn here for the Police Training Academy, which is not far from our club house.



In just over a mile, you will come to the Davidsonville Family Recreation Center seen below. Don't turn left. Continue slightly to the right.



You will then turn left into the first entrance, shown below, going straight ahead between the buildings and up the hill to the club house. It is clearly marked as the Anne Arundel Radio Club, has two 40 foot towers attached to it, and a 198 foot repeater tower to it's rear left. I doubt you will need a picture to find it.
